January 16, 2024

#### Claudia's Lemon Cake (from 2023 SONA Picnic)

#### CAKE

- 2 c. all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp baking soda
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp salt
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$  c. granulated sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$  c. (1 stick) unsalted butter softened
- 3 large eggs
- 1 c. buttermilk
- 2 T finely grated lemon rind
- 2 T fresh lemon juice

#### INSTRUCTIONS

# 1. To prepare pan, coat 2 - 8" round cake pans with cooking spray sides and bottom. Line bottoms with parchment or wax paper cut to size. Coat over this with cooking spray. Dust pans with 1 to 2 T flour.

- 2. Grate lemon peel and juice lemons for later.
- 3. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- 4. Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt, stirring with a whisk.
- 5. Place granulated sugar and softened butter in a large bowl. Beat with a mixer at medium speed until well blended about 5 minutes.
- 6. Add eggs, one at a time. Beat well after each is added. Add the flour mixture and nonfat buttermilk alternately to sugar mixture.
- 7. Finally beat in the lemon rind and lemon juice by hand. (Why? The lemon rind sticks to the beaters and you lose half of it.)
- 8. Pour batter into prepared pans. Sharply tap on the counter to remove all bubbles. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 -30 minutes. Cake is done when toothpick comes out clean and it is separated from the sides.
- 9. Cool in pans for 15 minutes on a wire rack.
- 10. Remove onto wax paper by firmly tapping the cake upside down. Cool completely.

11. I take the cakes in the wax paper like a cradle and put them back in pans, placing in the freezer when they have cooled, each in a plastic bag. I do this so they are solid and easy to frost later. When you take them out, grab the wax paper on the sides, pull them out and put them on the plate.

12. To make a buttercream frosting, juice lemons to give yourself  $\frac{1}{4}$  c. lemon juice, and another 2 T lemon rind.

13. Place  $\frac{1}{2}$  c. (1 stick) softened butter in a bowl. Add 4 c. powdered sugar and lemon juice and beat until smooth. If too stiff, add milk or cream. Stir in the lemon rind.

14. Frost the cake with a rubber spoon or spatula. You can put the frosting on top of each layer or you can frost it completely. Cut some lemon rind strips for the top.

PS It looks gorgeous with candied violets (something you can easily make dipping violet flowers and leaves in frothy egg white and fine crystalized sugar. Violets are in abundance in Salisbury Oaks – make sure they have not been treated with chemicals)

#### FROSTING

- $\frac{1}{2}$  c. softened unsalted butter
- 4 c. powdered sugar
- 1/4 c. fresh lemon juice (about)
- 2 T. grated lemon rind (about)
- lemon rind strips or candied violets
